Scope

This bibliography lists publications related to child maltreatment issues authored by Dr. Dierdre Brown. Dr. Brown is an Associate Professor in the Department of Psychological Medicine in the Dunedin School of Medicine at the University of Otago, New Zealand. She was previously a member of the clinical psychology training program and School of Psychology at Victoria University of Wellington for 12 years. Deirdre completed her PhD and training in clinical psychology at the University of Otago, and subsequently held postdoctoral fellowships at the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (USA) and Lancaster University (UK). Her primary research interests relate to children's participation in the justice system as witnesses, and how to effectively elicit safe and reliable evidence from them, as well as understanding jurors' expectations and understanding of children's abilities and vulnerabilities. She works alongside Oranga Tamariki and New Zealand police to provide training to Specialist Child Witness Interviewers.
