Scope

Michael E. Lamb is Emeritus Professor of Psychology and former Head of the then Department of Social and Developmental Psychology at the University of Cambridge. He received his Ph.D. from Yale University in 1976. He is known for his influential work in developmental psychology, child and family policy, social welfare, and law. His research focuses on forensic interviewing and the factors affecting children's adjustment and he and his colleagues have shown how developmentally sensitive interviewing improves the amount and quality of information obtained from young victims, witnesses and offenders in investigative settings, developing and validating the NICHD Protocol in a series of studies that began in 1990. He currently edits the journal, *Psychology, Public Policy, and Law*.
