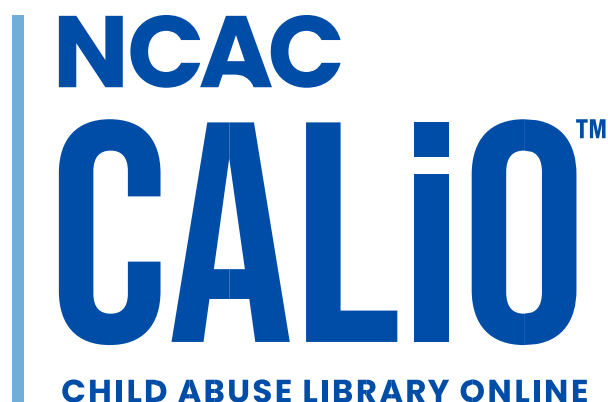

This bibliography lists publications related to child maltreatment issues authored by Dr. Henry Otgaar of the Netherlands. Dr. Otgaar works as a research professor at the Leuven Institute of Criminology (KU Leuven) and as a professor of Legal Psychology at the section Forensic Psychology, Maastricht University. His research concentrates on developmental changes in memory from childhood to adulthood and factors that relate to the development of memory illusions. He is frequently involved as an expert witness in legal cases concerning the reliability of eyewitness testimonies, especially those involving child witnesses. Current studies focus on precursors of children's and adults' false memories, adaptive memory, delayed disclosure of sexual abuse, and interviewing children.
