Program: Child Abuse Library Online Logic Model

Situation: Child abuse and neglect is a major, continuing public health problem, with high public visibility and concern.

Professionals working in fields related to child abuse require authoritative and research-based information for decision making and best practices, but lack local access to that information. NCAC is positioned and tasked with meeting that need through training and information dissemination programs designed to achieve Research into Practice.
